## About Non-Collegiate Women's Education Board (NCWEB)

Non-Collegiate Women's Education Board (NCWEB) has been silently contributing towards empowerment of women through education since 1944. At that time, the idea was to provide a platform to girl students to take examinations with special coaching without attending regular classes. Over the years, this gave shape to an institution that provided for the needs of educating girls who were in a disadvantaged position to attend regular classes in colleges. NCWEB is a constituent part of University of Delhi and is in a unique disposition to endow those who have the potential to change and give thrust to socioeconomic development in the society through education. This institution has an arrangement where the girl students attend classes during Saturday/Sunday and academic breaks across the twenty-six centres being run in the constituent colleges of University of Delhi for undergraduate courses and for post graduate courses, at the NCWEB centre respectively. These centres provide for library and other facilities besides utilizing the existing resources and infrastructure of the colleges. The Board also gives financial aid and book loan facility to the needy and desirous students. At present, nearly 34,000 girl students are studying in the institution. Many among those who have studied in this institution have not only stood on their own but have also been pillar of strength to their families. This institution is dedicated to the cause of nation-building by empowering those with education, who play a pivotal role in moulding the society.

## **About Indian Council of Social Science Research (ICSSR)**

India has had a long, cumulative and rich tradition of thought production in social and human sciences since the Rigveda (1500 BCE). The intellectual tradition since Panini has reflected on the social and cultural meaning and evolved epistemologies of enquiry for the attainment of knowledge based on observation, logical and rational thinking. After Independence, Bharat sought to regain its indigenous model of social and human sciences research that required decolonization of education and research. As the country's development process threw up numerous and diverse challenges that required extensive research and analysis, the Government of India established a Committee for Social Science Research under the Chairmanship of Professor V.K.R.V. Rao in 1965 to review the social science research scenario in the country and make recommendations to accelerate its progress. This led to the establishment of the Indian Council of Social Science Research (ICSSR) in 1969 to encourage, promote and fund social science research in the country. Since its inception, ICSSR has played a pivotal role in building the capacities of early career and senior researchers through grants and projects as well as training in research methodologies with the objective to produce high-quality research usable for policy intervention and policy making. It has also made immense contributions to humanities and cultural research as a way to decolonise the formations of self and society across the length and breadth of the nation.

It has been recognised that the need of the hour is to shift from merely documenting the 'exceptionalism' of India to engaging with the diverse social realities of the country with a philosophical stance of inwardness, so as to be able to develop an original and fresh understanding of a larger variety of issues, generate new theories and perspectives and represent the multiple voices of varied people of India.

In the 21st century, when the nation aims to become Viksit Bharat by its centenary year of Independence, 2047, ICSSR seeks to establish a symmetry between social research and society. In line with the recommendation of the National Education Policy (2020), we seek to make social research equitable, affordable, inclusive, socially sensitive and globally competitive.

The "भारतीय संविधान की बेटियाँ: विकसित भारत @ 2047 की ओर सशक्तिकरण के 75 वर्ष" national seminar aims to celebrate the 75th anniversary of the Indian Constitution by recognizing the pivotal role that women have played in shaping our democratic nation. As part of the Samvidhan Amrit Mahotsav, the seminar provides a platform for dialogue, reflection, and women's empowerment in making the Indian Constitution. It also strives to bring out those narratives and lesser-known stories of the contribution of Bharat Mata's brave daughters, who envisioned a more equal Bharat and were way ahead of their times. History writing in India in the post-independence era and the larger society, in general, has remained devoid of the contribution of women in making the Constitution.

This seminar attempts to bring academicians, young scholars, and researchers on one platform to relook at India's past from the vantage point of women and give them their due in historical and scholarly discussions. As India strives for a Viksit Bharat @2047 and calls for Nari Shakti, we must acknowledge the valuable contributions of India's daughters, who showed us the path of abiding by our duties and serving the country. The women occupied a very important position in the ancient Bharat. Literary evidence suggests that women were termed as 'shakti' (power, strength). To recognise the pivotal role that women have played in shaping our democratic nation, and to witness how women being the modern architects in the making of Bharat as 'Viswa Guru', Non-Collegiate Women's Education Board (NCWEB), University of Delhi, is proposing to organize a two-day National Seminar on the theme "भारतीय संविधान की बेटियाँ: विकसित भारत @ 2047 की ओर सशक्तिकरण के 75 वर्ष". ### **Guidelines for Abstract Submission**

- Submissions are to be made in Electronic format (MS Word Format typed in Hindi/English in Unicode/Times New Roman/12 point) only, and to be uploaded at the time of registration through Google form link: <https://forms.gle/TihDqwFPqxe1esm8>
- Each Abstract must be accompanied by a separate cover page including : Title of the Paper, Name of Author(s), Address of Author(s), E-mail and Contact details.
- Abstract of the paper should not be more than 250 words (including keywords).
- Seminar proceedings will be published with ISSN.
- Last date for Abstract submission is January 15, 2026.

### **Guidelines for Full Length Paper Submission**

- Papers are to be submitted only after notification of the acceptance of the abstract.
- Though the selected papers will be published in a journal for seminar proceedings having ISSN, the possibility of necessary amendments/ changes/ alterations in the papers by the authors cannot be denied in the future. For this purpose, additional time, if required, will be given to the original authors.
- Tables, illustrations, charts, figures, etc. should be placed within the text at appropriate places.
- Citation/references should be as per APA style (latest edition).

#### **Structure of the paper:**

- The paper should have a **running head**.
- The main body of the paper should start on the first page.
- Before the main body of the paper, the title of the paper (in bold), abstract (in italics) and the keywords (in bold) should be provided.
- Suggested word limit for the final submission should be approximately 2500-3000 words.
- NO changes in the paper title, abstract, authorship, and final paper can occur AFTER the submission deadline.
- The references must be given at the end of the paper in alphabetical order in any accepted style (e.g. APA or any other style).

*NOTE: It is to be noted that only original papers which have not been published previously or submitted for publication elsewhere can be submitted. The authors must give a declaration in black and white that the paper is his/her original work and has not been sent anywhere for publication or presentation. The authors of selected papers must accept to grant the copyright of the papers to the Non-Collegiate Women's Education Board (NCWEB) for the use of papers or parts thereof in any form or purpose. The research papers should be according to the UGC's new anti-plagiarism policy that allows up to 10% content similarity.*

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

